

Ducks Try to Boost Stock Against U of I

Oregon Meets Idaho Today In ND Tilt

Oregon's Ducks, merrily riding the crest of the flow tide which threatens to wash out from under Oregon State their meager 1½-game lead, tackle the cellarite Idaho Vandals today at Moscow in the first tilt of their strenuous six-game-a-week - seven - days marathon.

Oregon State was joyously sailing along without a care in the world—no losses in six starts—when "Boom!", the Webfoots struck and the Beaver ship was scuttled. That upset, 6 to 5, Wednesday, curdled Orange hopes for a perfect record, and placed the Beavers in a vulnerable spot, within striking distance of both Oregon and Washington, tied for second place.

Ducks Favored

The Ducks are odds-on favorites to perpetrate a "double steal" of the two-game series today and tomorrow. Three weeks ago, Oregon plundered, sacked, and looted the Vandals in an atrocious manner.

The opener was captured, 16 to 2, with the Duck stickers getting all the hitting they wanted. In the aftermath, the heavy Oregon artillery plus some extremely frugal chucking by Bob Rieder, gave our boys an 3 to 0 triumph.

Hobby Hobson's biggest worry will be in the pitching department. To weather the grueling half dozen contests which lie ahead, Hobson selected five twirlers for the trip. All, undoubtedly, will see action in an effort to distribute more equally the throwing chores. Hobson may summon anyone of this quintet for mound duty today: Nick Begleries, Bob Rieder, Nelson Sandgren, John Babalo, or Lefty Al Wimer.

Guy Wicks, Idaho headman, will probably counter with either Vic Berilus or Lefty Crowley on the rubber.

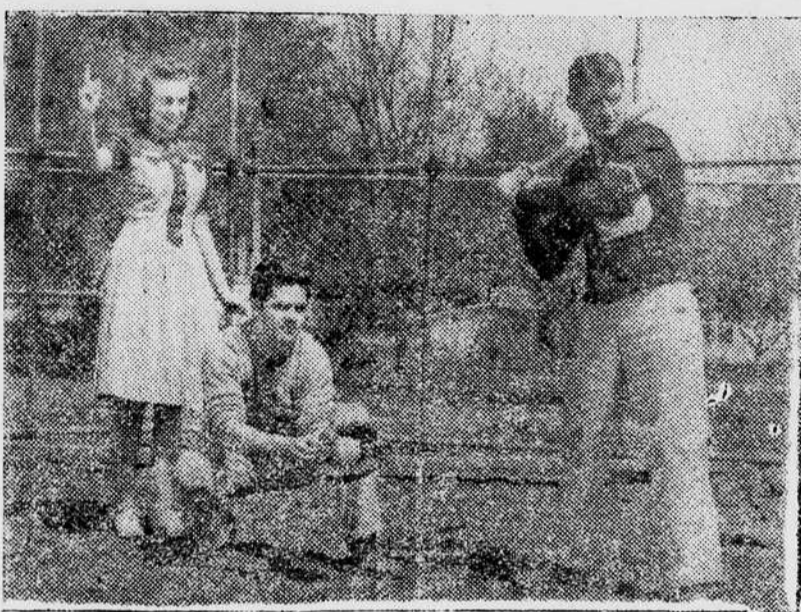
Chi Os Score 3

Sparsely-Manned Track Team Heads for Pullman

The smallest track squad in Oregon history will embark for the Inland Empire some time this afternoon. They have their second dual meet of the year with one of the toughest teams in the conference, Washington State.

The 14-man squad is scheduled to leave on the 4:40 p.m. train, but they haven't been on schedule, and it is possible that the cindermen will have to take the bus to Portland and the train from there to Pullman.

All members of the traveling squad are urged to keep in contact with Anse Cornell until noon today, in order to make sure of transportation means.

Choose 14 Men

The 14 men are the most versatile men on the squad. Hayward had to pick them in order to place one man in every event. It is possible that the Webfoots will be without a relay team, however.

The squad includes Don Wilson, mile; Francis Tuckwiler, 440; Kenny Oliphant, 100; Zenas Butler and Ralph Kramer, 120-yard high hurdles; Stan Skillicorn, 880; Bob Simpson and Kramer, 220; Bill Ross and Wilson, two mile; Butler and Oliphant, 220-yard low hurdles; Homer Thomas, pole vault; Bob Newland, high jump; Fred Foster, discus; Chuck El-

liot and Foster, shot; Warren Finke, javelin. An attempt will be made to pick Ed Reiner up in Portland to compete in the middle distance events.

Small Squad

"It's a very makeshift lineup, but it's the best I've got and it'll have to do," Hayward declared yesterday. Although the squad as a whole is small this year, some who are usually dependable will have to be left home because of high transportation costs.

Although nobody was listed for the broad jump, it is possible that Butler and Newland will be entered. This leaves the bulk on the shoulders of swift Zenas Butler. He is entered in the high hurdles, low hurdles, probably the broad jump and possibly the 100. This has been his duty thus far in the season.

There is a possibility that Hayward will not make the trip, and the remaining two will be Trainer Bob Officer, and Manager Bob McKinney.
