CPT Program 'Accelerated'

"Accelerated has now been added to the name of the civilian pilot training program, it was announced by J. C. Stovall, CPT coordinator. Beginning with the summer program, which will start between June 15 and July 1, a new class will enter each 8 weeks, according to the present plan.

Applications are still being accepted for those who wish to take the next program, with both ground school and flight training being taught at the Klamath Falls base. Age requirements include all men between 18 and 26.

Mr. Stovall emphasized that men enlisted in the deferred section of either the army or navy would also be eligible for CPT training. Students completing the

primary course will be given an opportunity to go into the secondary phase of training. Chances for further cross-country and student instructor training will be given those not enlisted with the regular armed forces.

Under the present set-up the government will pay for both the physical examination and the insurance, Mr. Stovall revealed. Subsistence of the men, while in Klamath Falls, will be furnished by the flight operator, Louis Soukup.

Those not planning to take the courses this summer are still urged to apply now if they are interested in any future CPT program. The office is located at 107 Condon hall.

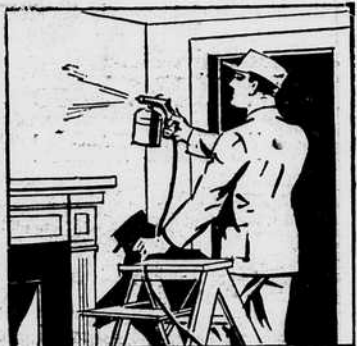
