Alumna of Class of '85 Dies at Eugene Home

Mrs. Anna Patterson Potter, a member of the first class of the University of Oregon in its opening year and a member of the class of 1885, died last Wednesday at the age of 81 in her home in Eugene.

Mrs. Potter's parents came west in the first wagon-train in 1843. She was born in Eugene September 13, 1861, and after graduation she taught school in Lane county. Funeral services were held here Friday.
