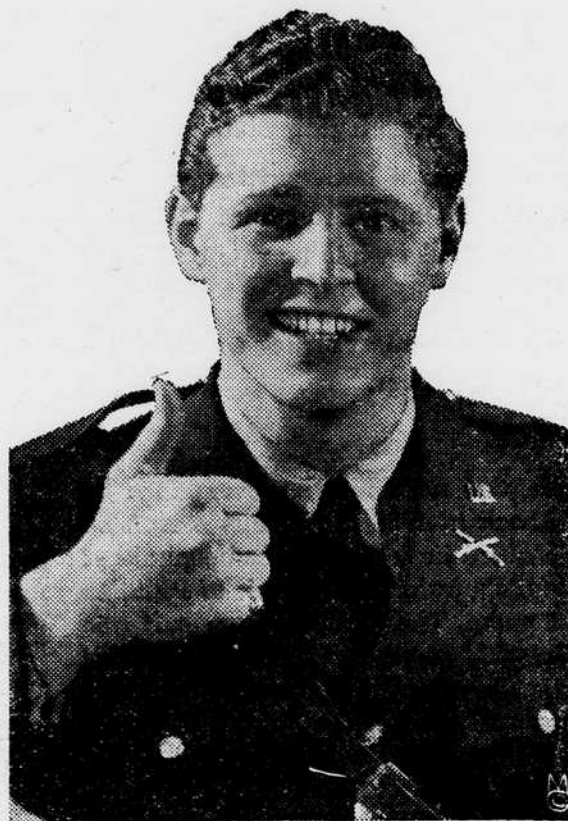
Miss Alden is organizing playground work for the elementary schools and Saturday classes in gymnasium and shop work for school children.
