

'Satisfactory' Students Now Deferred 4 Years

A joint factual pamphlet issued recently by the army, navy, and marines states that: "... all students are deferred until completion of their normal four-year college course, provided they maintain a satisfactory academic standing, maintain normal academic program, and attain a rating above the prescribed level in the qualifying examination which will be given near the end of the sophomore year."

The term "student" refers to those men who are enlisted in the deferment classes of the armed forces.

Satisfactory Standing

Dr. Carl F. Kossack, armed forces representative, interpreted the "satisfactory academic standing" as a 2.00 GPA. If the student falls below the minimum, he will be placed on probation for one term. If at the end of that term his grades have not shown improvement, the committee will recommend that the student's deferment be cancelled.

Dr. Kossack advised all men who are contemplating dropping courses which would bring their academic hour total below 15 to see him before they do so because it will be the attitude of the board to give the student who has an "F" in a course, if he has made an honest effort to learn, preference over the student who has a "W."

Example Cited

He cited as an example the case of the naval reserve who came to him and wanted to drop physics. Investigation showed that the fellow was playing football, was a house officer in his fraternity, and had other extra-curricular activities which took up his time.

Such a case would call for immediate cancellation of the deferment.

On the other side of the question is the problem of the instructor who takes more than his share of time. They will be asked to "lay off", too.

Above all, students should not stop going to classes and then come to see about dropping a course, said Dr. Kossack. They should continue with the course and then see about dropping. It is difficult to do anything with the weak student who has missed days, or even weeks of a class before dropping the course.

The deferment office holds discretionary powers and will not be arbitrary in the interpretation of the rules, but there must be definite extenuating circumstances before leniency will be shown.

Her condition is improving, according to Dean Allen.



Dr. Theodore Kratt, dean of the University school of music, Tuesday accepted the position of choral chairman of the Oregon Federation of Music clubs.


