invited by AWS to attend, although they're not obligated to be in costume.

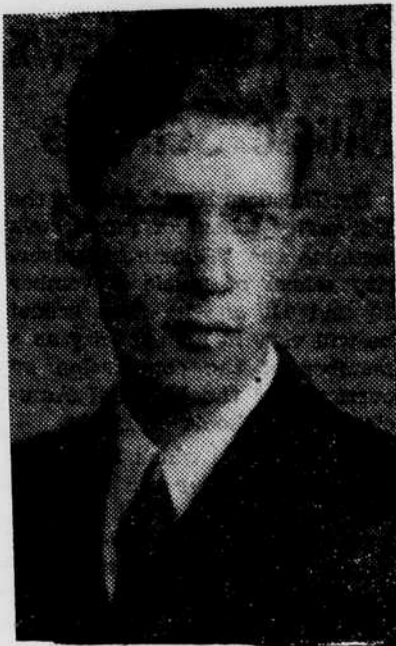
