During the December 15-January 5 period when chair cars are reserved for soldiers, sailors, and marines, and permanent passes are cancelled, Pullman accommodations will still be available probably on a "standing room only" basis.

Committee presenting the recommendation included Bill Macy, chairman; Mary Robinson, Jack Robinson, and Bill Farrell.


