

Clubs Tangle Again On Igloo Hardwoods

They've put one of those "Civil War" cage conflicts behind them, the bounding Beavers from Corvallis and the willowy Webfoots from our home town, but there's another hoop chiller on tap again, and it's here tonight on the well-scuffed mingles of the Igloo. These two clubs come to grips at 8 p.m.

Tonight's fray marks the first meeting of these two outfits on the McArthur boards and possesses all the ear-marks of real "natural."

After last evening's initial skirmish at Corvallis both clubs are more determined than ever to make good. The loser has intentions of making amends for last night's mistakes, while the winner is vowing to duplicate his previous success.

From all rumors emanating from the Corvallis rendezvous of the Orangemen, the quintet of Slat's Gill intend—strangely enough—to try and outrun Oregon at their own game. Now this very same hint was dropped last year when the UO-OSC casaba clashes were coming up, but Oregon State reverted to its old slow-'em-up style.

Just in case last year's ND titlists decided to run with our Webfoots this evening they are well equipped with speed-burning potentialities. In little Lew Beck, crafty one-year guard veteran, Mentor Gill has finesse, agility, and scoring talent galore. More than once Lew has lavishly heaped in goal after goal this year in a personal scoring spree.

Also capable of getting out of a dog-trot are Tommy Holman, freshman ace from Baker, Howard Jeffries, varsity reserve, and Bill Taitt, all-city flash from Roosevelt in Portland.

Durdan Out?

A question mark has been set up in front of the name of Don Durdan by the Oregon company. News dispatches from Corvallis for the last week have been dripping with remorse at the loss of the diminutive all-around athlete. Durdan was cursed by "iritis," an eye disease, following a siege of chicken pox and was reputedly out of action for the season.

Whether this was merely a "bear story" trumped up by enthusiastic Beaver publicists or is the straight goods remains to be seen. The general opinion from the Duck camp was that Durdan would be big as life by game time tonight.

Back in fine fettle is Erland (Andy) Anderson, OSC's brilliant sophomore center, who was out for one week with a shoulder ailment. Anderson has returned to the fold to bolster the scoring potency of the Beaver boys.

Forwards for the Orangemen in the Igloo scuffle will probably be Glen Warren, veteran top-notch, and Don Cecil, capable California transfer who has dovetailed into the Bevo lineup so nicely. Height is here, plus scoring punch.

Guards appear to be the aforementioned Mr. Beck and Freshman Holman—unless Durdan is ready for duty. In that event he will probably substitute for the young rook who clogged the guard hole so effectively when Durdan was on the shelf.

Hobby's boys will be able to give the Beavers a rugged tussle on the backboards with rugged Warren Taylor, Rolph Fuhrman, and gigantic Roger Wiley real battlers after a loose ball.

Remainder of the Duck lineup will probably be composed of Captain Don Kirsch and Stan Williamson on guards.

Last year the four game series went to Oregon State by a three-to-one advantage. The Ducks captured the first tussle after a heated struggle, 47 to 45, on the Igloo floor.

Then the Beaver quintet leaped back with decisiveness to run up three straight over a failing Oregon aggregation. Game number two went to the Oregon State, 50 to 39. The last two contests were much closer—27 to 26 and 49 to 45.

son forced shots through the twine, and OSC led 5 to 3.

OSC Holds Lead

Having feasted once, the Beavers were reluctant to surrender their rights to the Ducks and so proceeded to heap on additional points.

Oregon shooting eyes were definitely off and the locals could make connections on only 11 field baskets out of 63 attempts. Their average from the free throw lanes was little better.

Dominance on the backboard was also another Oregon State strong feature, with Anderson again making himself obnoxious.

Basket-accurate Lew Beck then exerted his exceptional powers on the hoop once more to give the OSCers a 7 to 4 margin. Oregon's Warren Taylor followed up with a gifter but Bill Taitt, freshman forward, rammed a long one in to raise the count to 9 to 5.

Anderson tipped one in. Durdan canned a pusher, and two free tosses set the Oregon State total at 15. Meanwhile Oregon raised their points to 8 when Captain Don Kirsch swished one from 15 feet away.

Waxing vengeful, the difference between the two clubs was chopped to two thin points, 15 to 13, as Wally Borrevik and Roy Seeborg connected.

With three minutes left in the half each side pummeled the hemp and the squads retired dressing-room-ward with the score 23-18.

A hypo couldn't have imbued more spirit in the Beavers any better than did Slat's Gill's mid-


