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in the 300 yard medley relay, the 50 yard freestyle event, the 100 yard freestyle, and the 400 yard freestyle relay. The freshman and transfer swimmers that the Oregon squad has this season are really assets to the squad especially in the case of this young freshman, Gautier.

For example in the 400 yard freestyle relay, a recent time trial clocked the team of Nelson, Smith, Gautier, and Hoffman with the best time of the season, 3:43.3. Last night in the same time trial event without Gautier, the same team was clocked at 3:44. The present Pacific coast record in this event is 3:42.2, held by Oregon, which it garnered in the 1942 season.

This record in the 400 yard freestyle relay now held by Oregon is expected to be broken this morning. The Oregon squad is intent on doing this, which would repeat the performance of last Saturday's meet with Oregon State, where Ralph Huestis broke a record that was held by another Oregon man Jack Dallas in the 100 yard breaststroke event.

Another record that Coach Mike Hoyman expects his boys to break is the event of the 100 yard freestyle. Last Saturday the Oregon boys fell a wee bit short of the record mark, but with the added push and power given them by this last week's workouts the boys are going after it again.
