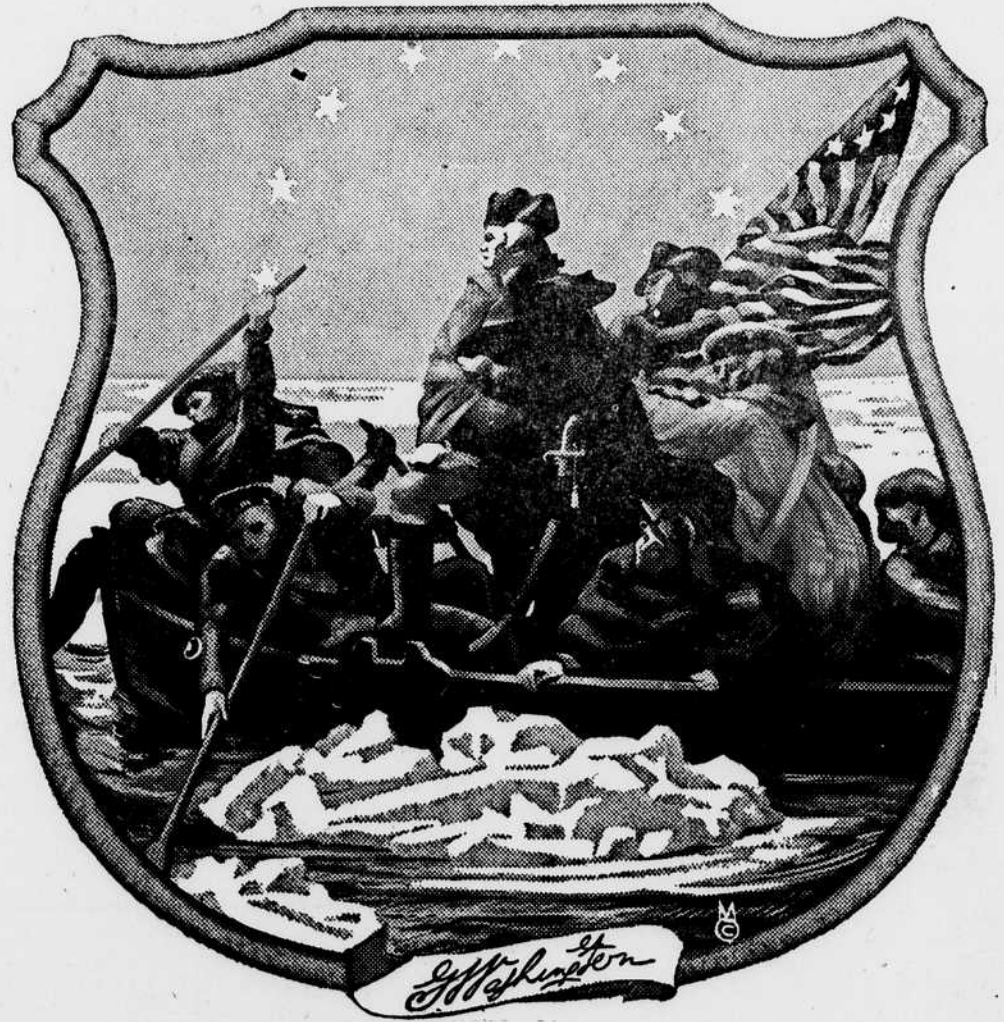
Concerts Replace Artists Series

No season tickets will be sold to townspeople as in the past, but tickets will be available for the individual attractions.

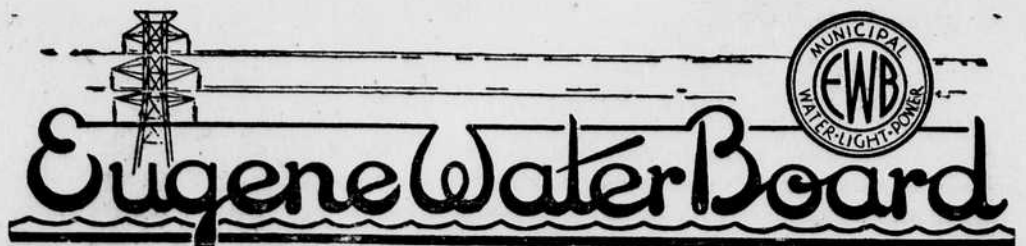
Definite information has not been released on what will be presented, Educational Activities Manager Horace Robinson said, but their audience appeal will be equal to any offered in the past.
