Navy Drops Whitman

The Willamette team will come here Saturday for their last game of the season fresh from a victory over the Whitman college Pioneers by a decisive 20-0 tally. They have been playing and practicing for five weeks, compared to the ASTU's two. They are reported to be strong both in the air or on power plays, and in fact their whole system of offense is built around the "power play" theory, depending upon smashing line drives to make the points.

Ashcom Reports

Also on hand was Oregon's powerful Dick "Cruiser" Ashcom, one of the toughest men on last year's team.

According to Dick the ASTU boys look pretty green, as they are for the most part "just out of high school." "They need more practice," he said, and evidently Warren thought so too, as he rushed them through play after play, concentrating on strong line defense and offense in preparation for the strategies of the Navycats.

Heavy Team

The team may be short on experience, but they are not in this classification when it comes to weight, the line tipping the scales with a 200 pound average, and the backfield running a nice 160 average.

Lt. Robert G. Davis, manager of the team, expressed the belief that the boys will be out to clean up on the navy, but Coach Warren was not waiting around for prophecies, he was out on the field giving the army the works; hoping Lt. Davis was right.
