Membership is open to anyone interested in science and a small yearly fee is charged.

ture tours to England and this summer was there at the invitation of the archbishop of Canterbury.

Dr. Van Kirk attended the Universal Christian conference in Stockholm on life and work in 1925; a Prague World Conference of Christians in 1928; and the World Youth Peace conference in Holland the same year. In 1935 he made an extensive trip to Russia where he was given an opportunity to study religious conditions of that country.

In 1938 Dr. Van Kirk represented various national organizations at the Pan-American conference in Lima, Peru. While there he gave a radio digest of Secretary Hull's closing address before the conference.

In 1940 Dr. Van Kirk attended the special conference of American States in Havana.

He has been a frequent visitor to the White House where he consulted with President Roosevelt on matters touching upon foreign policy.
