

Bonds Will Elect UO Victory Girl

Receipts for these purchases are needed to determine the dates on which the bonds were bought. Those bought prior to December 1 will not be counted.

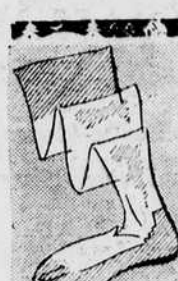
