
# Speaker Tells Of Coed Rights

Co-speakers at the AWS assembly Tuesday afternoon, were Orlando J. Hollis, acting president of the University, and Staff Sergeant L. L. Pittenger, in charge of marine corps women's reserve recruiting in Eugene.

Mr. Hollis, in his first public address to the students, spoke on the present day coed and what a girl should gain from professional training. Objecting to the term "career" in the usual meaning of the word, Mr. Hollis listed other opportunities available to college women, among them the right to participate in the government of the country and to be a full fledged citizen in addition to, in the majority of cases, married life.
