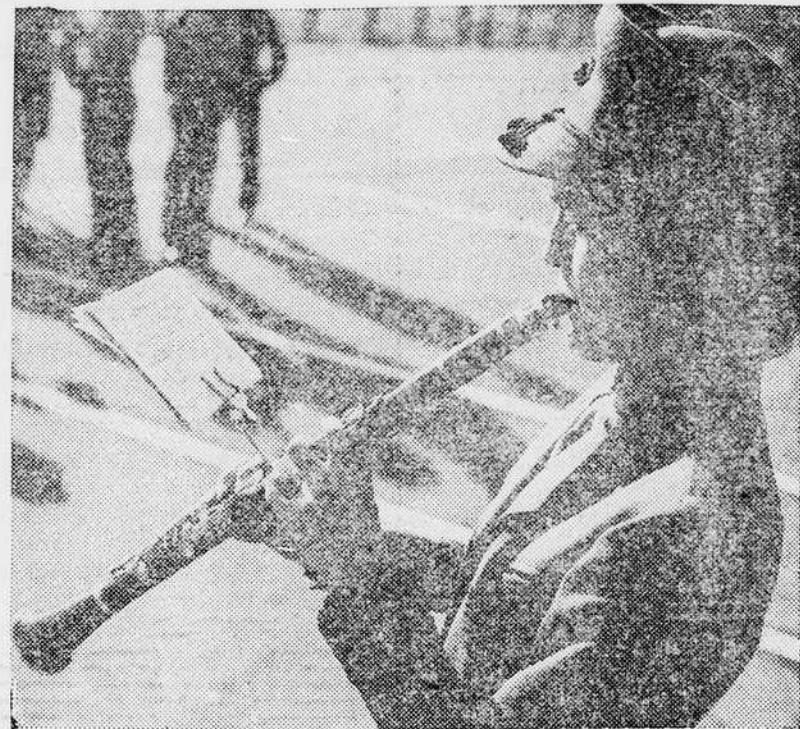
**Speaker Tells Of Coed Rights**

Co-speakers at the AWS assembly Tuesday afternoon, were Orlando J. Hollis, acting president of the University, and Staff Sergeant L. L. Pittenger, in charge of marine corps women's reserve recruiting in Eugene.

Mr. Hollis, in his first public address to the students, spoke on the present day coed and what a girl should gain from professional training. Objecting to the term "career" in the usual meaning of the word, Mr. Hollis listed other opportunities available to college women, among them the right to participate in the government of the country and to be a full fledged citizen in addition to, in the majority of cases, married life.

In concluding his talk, Mr. Hollis congratulated the coeds on their adjustment to war-college life, although he stated that no one in this country has been inconvenienced to any great extent in comparison to other countries because of the war.

Sergeant Pittenger, speaking on the marine corps women's reserve stated that the deadline date for recruiting is May 11, and that there are only 18 vacancies for the

month of March in the entire Portland, Klamath Falls, Salem, and Eugene district. Stating that there are over 15,000 women in the marine corps women's reserves, Sergeant Pittenger recalled that nine of these are from the University of Oregon.

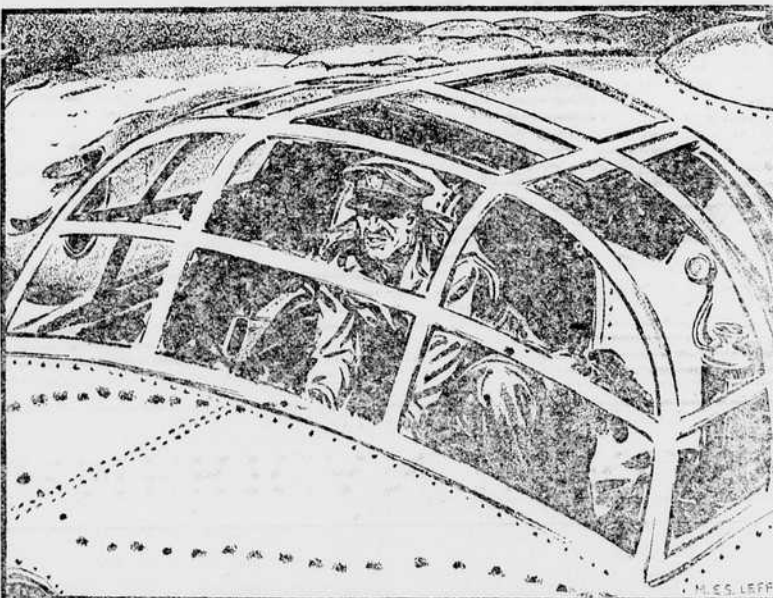

**Mexican Movie Set for Monday**

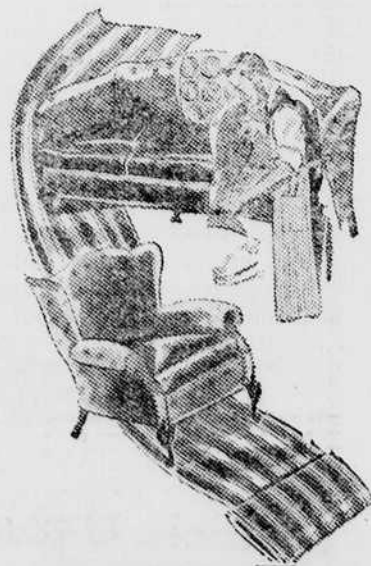
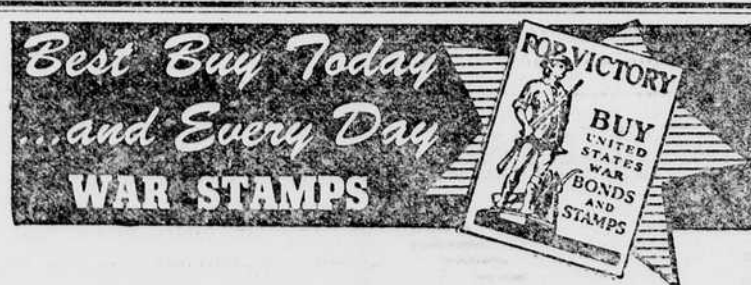

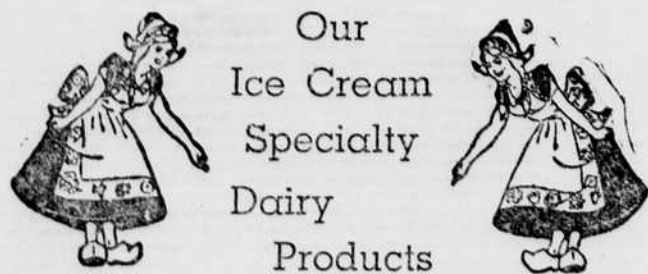
