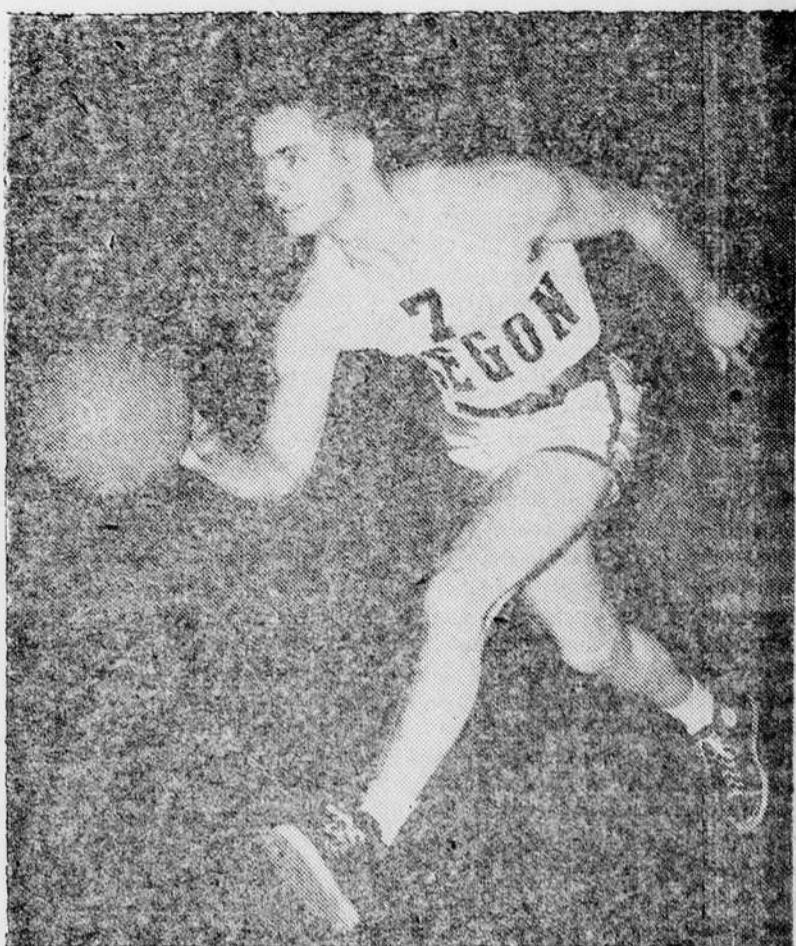
Oregon State and Idaho are tied for the third position, and Washington State is in the cellar.

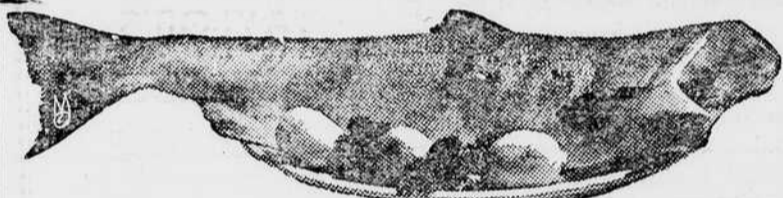
