

RedCross Issues Call ForCommitteeHeads

Four committee chairmen—disaster relief, nurses' aide, sewing, and first aid—are desired by the newly-formed Red Cross chapter on the campus. The only qualifications for the positions are that the girls must be interested in the committee work. Candidates should call Carol Wicke, Red Cross chairman, at 1309, giving their names and year in school.

Coordinating with Lane county in case of flood, fire, or other disasters of that nature will be the function of the disaster relief committee. Their immediate duty will be to determine what facilities the University can offer.

The chairman of the nurses' aide committee must be a nurses' aide and very interested in the work. Her job will be to keep a record of coeds trained for that work, of those now working, and the number of hours each contributes.

Like former campus units, the sewing group will work with the Eugene chapter in arranging for the completion of needed sewing.

An accurate record of all students, now on the campus, who have standard and advanced first aid cards, or instructor cards, will be kept by the first aid committee. They will also seek increased interest in first aid.

Those who are interested in serving on the Red Cross, but not on any of the above committees, may apply for other committees which will be organized later.

quent, empty words she heard.

"The war in Spain seemed a much more personal thing. So many of us left Geneva to see what really happened," she told listeners. "There we found that people of the republic very often had only butcher knives and other kitchen implements to fight with."

She told of how close the war felt when almost every time they crossed streets in Madrid they would have to step over dead bodies.

Before leaving the Spanish fighting area, she went into one of the front line towns back in the mountains with another Norwegian war correspondent, Nordahl Grieg, one of Norway's most promising young writers before his death last December. They were the only two civilians in the military area, and they caused some consternation, but they did manage to get into town and see that the republicans actually held it.

When the Germans entered Norway, she explained, the people resisted longer than any other country which had been invaded previously. But when the nazis gained control, they immediately closed all schools, and imprisoned or exported all university professors, without exception, to Germany.

The Red Cross worker stated that there are numerous projects which the University Red Cross unit hasn't yet started, but that additional activities are beginning very soon.

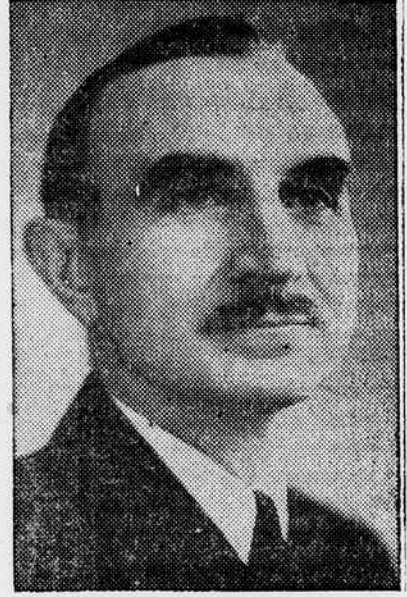
After inspecting the other college units in Oregon, Miss Robertson is planning to come through Eugene again about April 20.
