Theater Tolerant, Claims Seybolt

Mrs. Otilie Seybolt, associate professor of speech and dramatic arts, has returned to the campus from a year's sabbatical leave at Columbia University, New York. There she has been studying languages and English literature, and observing the drama groups at Yale, Mount Holyoke, Hunter college, Columbia university, and especially Broadway itself.

"I feel that the interest in drama this year is in two places—musical productions of which Oklahoma is the most outstanding example still playing, and negro productions," Mrs. Seybolt stated, giving "Carmen Jones" and the very recent "Anna Lucresta" as examples of the latter.

"The negro is having an opportunity which he never had before and is making good in it," continued Mrs. Seybolt as she expressed the belief that the theater can become a strong factor in racial tolerance.

Stating that she believes musicals to be superior to other types of dramas this last year, Mrs. Seybolt was especially interested in "Mexican Hayride" the cast of which included Dorothy Durkee, a former graduate in drama of the University of Oregon.

UO Handbook to Make Appearance at Igloo

Under the title of "The Oren-ter" a new University handbook for Freshmen and new students will be distributed free at registration.

Charles Politz, senior in journalism, edited the handbook, which is filled with advice, comments, and cartoons.

One hundred and twenty pages in length, "The Oren-ter" is a yellow, cartoon-covered booklet containing pictures and writeups on personnel, introductions to organizations and their leaders, lists of eating and amusement places, constitutions of the ASUO, AWS, and WAA, and traditions and songs of the University of Oregon.
