"It gives me a sense of satis faction to find that the AST's wel comed the opportunity to join combat assignments," Kilburn ad ded. "I have had several Oregon graduates under my command, and they have proved themselves high ly qualified and energetic.'

> Advocates Total Victory

A graduate of West Point and the Army War College in Washtington, D. C., and a veteran of World War I, General Kilburn is an interested student of military history. He remarked that at the end of the last world war he per sonally had anticipated the present conflict because World War I was terminated by appeasement. "This war," he believes, "must mean the complete defeat of the philosophy that through becoming strong and ruthless a government can dominate the people.
Asked about the possibility of a third world war, Kilburn stated that this would be ruled out provided the United States remained dominant physically, mentally, and militarily.
"We must be prepared to resist actively whenever the occasion demands. Appeasement by the indi vidual or the nation is a sign of inherent weakness. The American people must wake up to the fact that war, no matter how insignifi cant or where located, will affect is directly."
