

that in 1933 with 173, and Galer of Washington repeated the next year by hitting the 176 mark. In 1936 the longest standing score was made by Wally Palmberg of OSC, who poured in 187 counters.

An interesting fact to remember is that all of these records were set when the rules were very much different. You had a jump ball after every basket, and it's easy to imagine how much slower the game was.

Even when the game became faster and featured higher scores, it took six years before Palmberg's record was passed. The 1942 Idaho squad featured bespectacled, southpaw Ray Turner, who hit the basket for 192 points to break the long standing mark.

Even 192 points were only good for one season, however, as Gail Bishop of Washington State put the court hemps through workouts that seemed destined to last a good many years. Bishop hit a seemingly tremendous total of 224 points during the 16 games conference

WSC Man High Again

Vince Hansen of Washington State didn't start the season out in a blaze of glory, but by the time conference play had started he was creeping up in the scoring column. And now with two games left, the towering six-foot, nineinch center has tied Bishop's mark.
