spent nine years as an official in
the administrative department of
the Chinese railway. He was a
member of the second world opium
conference in Geneva and has been
an officer of the World's Student
Christian federation with head-
quarters in Geneva.

The pundit Dr. Koo, who wears
his native dress, speaks with the
power of a prophet, the sagacity of
a sage, and the sheer grace of an
artist, according to reports from
those who have met him. When he
talks about the situation in the
Orient, it is as a statesman of the
New Day, with full understanding
of the causes and insights for the
future. On informal occasions, Dr.
Koo may be persuaded to produce
his flute and enthrall his listeners
with Chinese airs, plaintive and
gay traditional songs of the cen-
turies.

Dr. Koo will undoubtedly have
some first hand information to tell
the people of Eugene about the
San Francisco conference and the
future that China has to play as a
world power in the postwar world.




