

Normal Life Is Veteran Counselor's Advice to Vets Returning to School

Advice to prospective veteran students at the University of Oregon can be summed up in the words of Emmett F. McGraw, head of the veterans administration guidance center located in the physical education building on the campus: "Come down and live a normal life just like other students."

The purpose of this center is to assist any veteran with his problems. This includes selection of a training program and an employ-

ment objective. Tests, both mental and manual, accomplish this goal. The office is also concerned with the granting of benefits to veterans under the G.I. Bill of Rights and Public Law 16.

There is no way of accurately determining the number of veterans that will be in school this coming year. Last year there were 194 at the peak, and the forecast for 1945-46 is approximately 600, or three times as many.

The biggest problem of veterans faces those who are married. Housing for them and their families is very hard to find. All veterans sometimes find the first term a little tough because of the difficulty of learning to study, but soon they pick up the habit again.

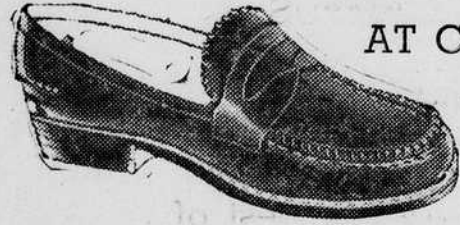
Most veterans who have already started school under a government program have adjusted themselves into the social and academic life. They have taken their part in extra-curricular activities and the social aspects of college life the same as the regular students. This seems to be the best recipe for the success of the veteran in school.
