The alumni office will soon revise the list of Oregon men who died in service now appearing on the Memorial plaque in the lobby of Johnson hall. Before this is done, the Alumni office requests that students report the names not appearing on the plaque at present of former Oregon students who have been killed in World War II, where they were killed, their rank, and any other information in order that the reprinting will be as complete as possible.

Students may report new information at Room 8, Friendly hall either in person or by letter.

Sometime in the future a permanent memorial will replace the

plaque as a reminder of former students who have given their lives in military service. Over a thousand dollars has already been collected toward this end.
