Monday morning quarterbacks are backing the Huskies for the Rose Bowl after an underated Gold and Purple eleven smashed a determined Trojan horse in Seattle Saturday. Although the Trojans outplayed the Washington club, this factor was not enough to bring victory to USC despite the fact that the visitors led 7-6 going into the last ten minutes of play. A fourth down pass from the 17 yard line proved to be the margin of victory (what a victory). To all intents and purposes a field goal attempt was in order but Wally Dash, freshman place-kicker, let go with a seventeen yard pass to Gordon Hungar in the end zone and victory was Washington's.

That home town football jinx still rides high and after Saturday's results one might just as well forget about the Rose Bowl for three or four weeks. As far as Washington and UCLA are concerned, both squads face the unfortunate and deadly task of traveling; if the past is any indication of the future the Huskies and Bruins will suffer at least one more defeat before the close of the season.

USC May Pull Comeback

The Trojans have the breaks and what breaks, all of their games at the Los Angeles Coliseum; should the Webfoots come back and upset the Husky wrecking crew Saturday, the Trojans would assume their former position at the head of the pack.

The traveling jinx, as it is called, took the Webfoots for a ride again, the third time this season, even though Bobby Reynolds and Jake Leicht gave the Bruin staff plenty to meditate about in the first half, Cal Rossi and Jack Porter came through in the second half to bring victory to the Bruins. Oregon just didn't have the reserves and that was all there was to it, the Bruins used their 20 lettermen at will and the tide began to change late in the third quarter. The outcome might have been different if the Webfoots had not muffed four excellent scoring opportunities, three of them in the first half. Jake Leicht proved what the publicity and sports writers had been saying about him all season. Leicht played on a par with Cal Rossi even though the Bruin ace netted more yardage, when you consider everything as a whole. Although our line outweighed the Bruin forward wall the Uclans used their experience to crash through and open holes in the Webfoot line for a throng of Bruin seat-backs.

Reynolds Rates High

Even though Bobby Reynolds wasn't the leading ground gainer, he nevertheless caught the attention of the scribes in the press box and several Los Angeles columnists came across with the statement that Bobby was the best and smoothest ball handling quarter back since the days of Frankie Albert and the "T" at Stanford.

During the halftime Dick Strite, athletic publicity director and sports editor of the Eugene Register-Guard made the statement that the football squad was a second half ball club just as the basketball team was last season. If the records are correct, the situation is just the reverse because in the five games played this season Tex and his boys have lost only when they were tied or trailing at the half. Where the Lemon and Green were leading at the half, victory was ours.

Every Other Week Charm

Portland is not the home field, but considering that Oregon wins every other week on their home field, the odds will be turned in favor of the Webfoots by virtue of the jinx, even though the grid prognosticators will favor the Huskies by 13 points. Another factor which should help Reynolds and company is the fact that our boys are out for revenge after taking a 20-6 defeat at the hands of the Welchmen in their first game of the season.

USC Rose Bowl Out

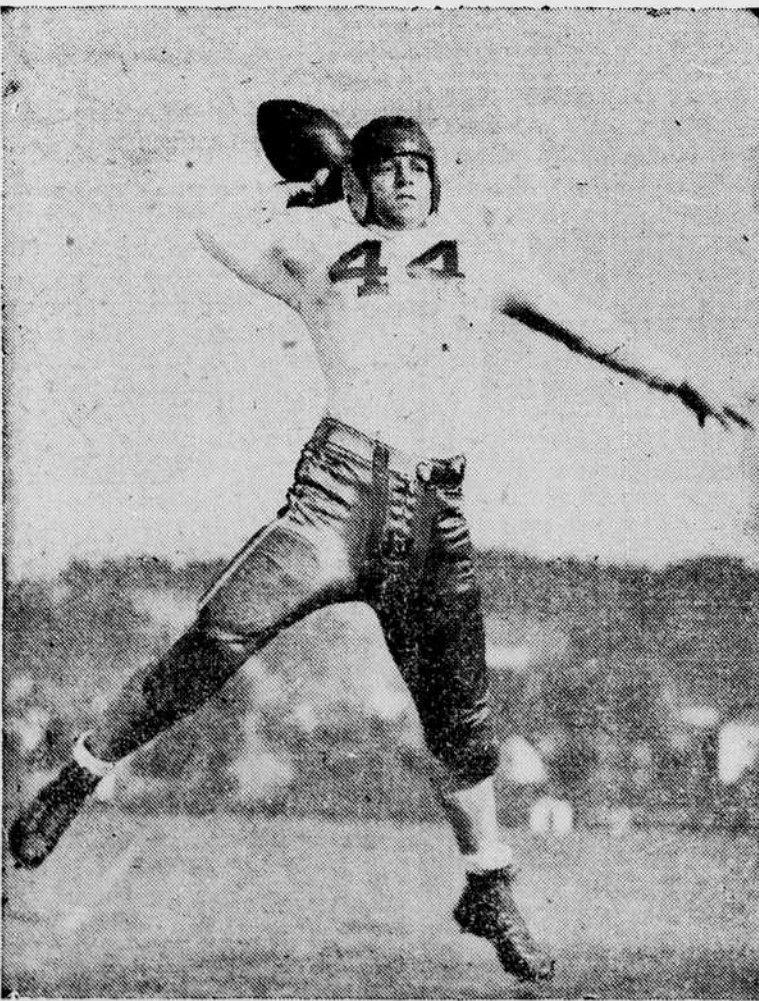
