Stunt Instructions

The instructions listed below will help students to understand the card trick routines:

1. Instruction sheets and colored cards will be tacked to each seat in the card section. Cards are to be left in their places until half time.
2. Tricks with proper color to be shown are listed numerically on the instruction sheet.
3. When arranging proper color card for each trick, remain in a crouched position until the signal

is given to rise to a sitting position.

4. Cards are to be held just below eye level during the stunt.

5. One yell will be given with each card trick.

6. When the stunts are through, colored cards should be passed to the aisle where they will be collected by the rally squad so that they may be used another day.

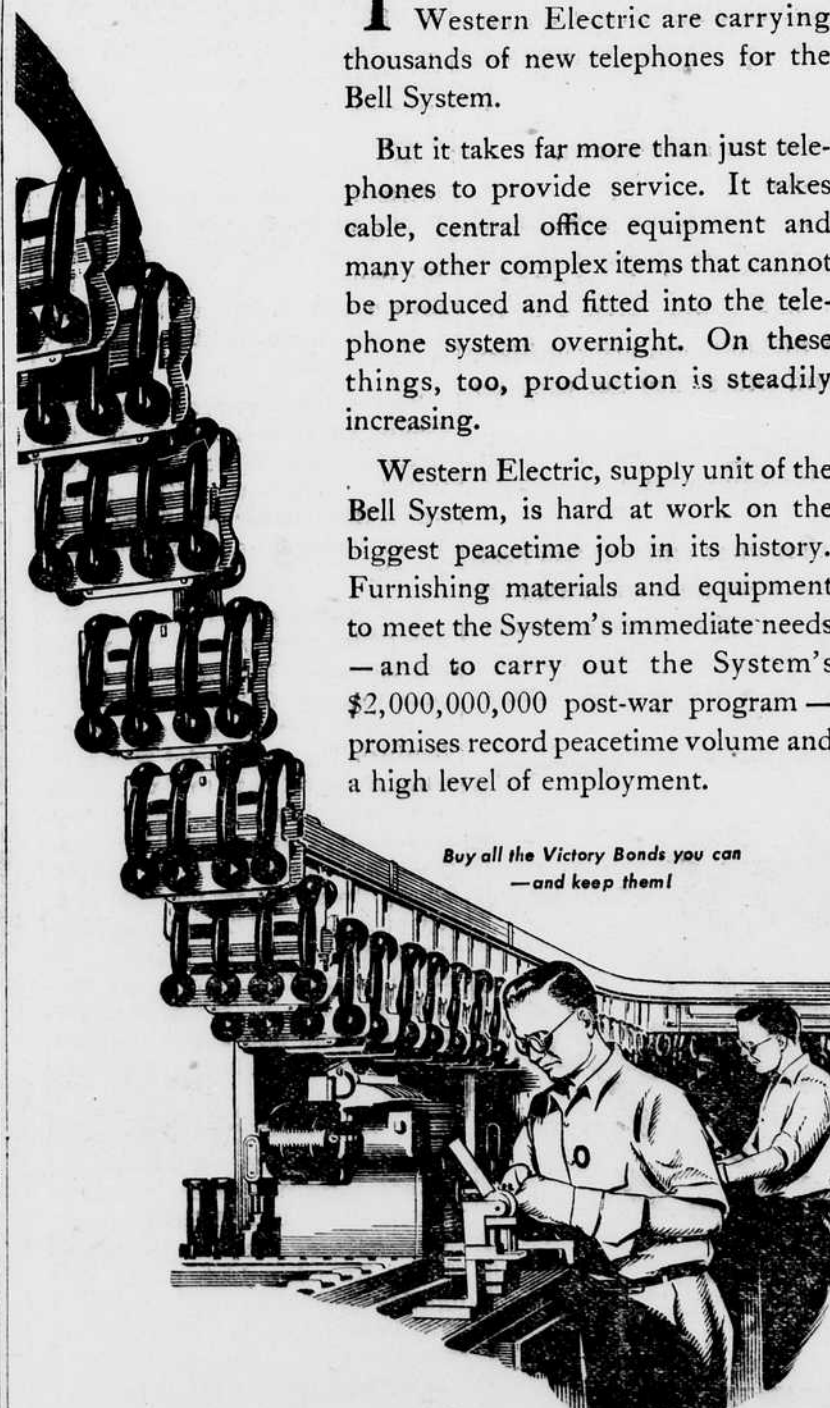
