Clifton James did more than well by his portrayal of Nick, a bar-tender who is the real thing. One of the most touching scenes in the play occurred when the mysterious Mary, an unhappy woman of quality and loveliness played by Marge Allingham, carried on a brief but poignant conversation with Joe.

Almost fixtures of the San Francisco waterfront are such characters as Willie, a marble-game maniac played by Charles Simpson; heart-smitten Dudley (Floyd Stapp); tap-dancer, would-

be comedian Harry (Dale Frederick); Wesley, a half-starved Negro who plays a mean and melancholy boogie-woogie piano (Lloyd Damaschofsky); and a battered Arab who plays a mournful wail upon a harmonica (Lee Petrask).

Others who wander in and out of the saloon during the story include McCarthy, a philosophical longshoreman (John McDonald); Kit Carson, a teller of tall tales (Jack Miller); Krupp, the troubled cop (Emerson Hoogstraal); cynical, snarling Blick (Bob Miller); Elsie, the object of Dudley's affections (Jacqueline Flug); and the singing newsboy, Jerrold Wycoff.

Further touches of bright color were added to the vibrantly human drama by the following roles: the drunk, Paul Marcotte; the slummers, Lynn Renick and Rodney Nelson; sailor, Donnel Wingate; Nick's daughter Anna, Muriel Light; Nick's mother, Marilyn Wherry; the killer, Pat Kimmick; streetwalker, Pat Smith; Lorene, Maxine Knorr.
