He was very much interested and wrote an article in the October, 1944, 'Record Changer.' This copy is the only one in existence, and the first one to turn up in 22 years. It is packed in cotton, locked up and waiting for such time as a re-issue can be made."

That's the letter, describing what Bill Russell and Fred Ramsey have called one of the "greatest jazz finds of the decade." For further words on same, get last year's, 1944, "Esquire Jazz Yearly." It is noted therein.

Modern Stylist

In case you don't know who Oliver was, I refer you to Charles Delauney's "Hot Discovery" or any of a million other works on the music. Best modern Oliver-stylist: Lu Watters "Yerba Buena Jazz Band," which played in S.
