Nearly 700 University students have already received jobs through the employment service, Mrs. Hathaway reports.

Approximately 400 women and some 300 men have taken jobs. Women are being hired for stenographic jobs and for child care. Men are wanted for a variety of service jobs.

Students wanting summer work and graduating seniors are urged to file their employment records now. Applications are available for summer work at Crater Lake and Mrs. Hathaway expects other reports to announce positions soon.

Lidice, Jarmila Novotna, Metropolitan Opera soprano, has recorded an album of Czech folk songs. Sung with quiet simplicity and charm, this recording has been called "one of the most moving and deeply felt recordings ever made." 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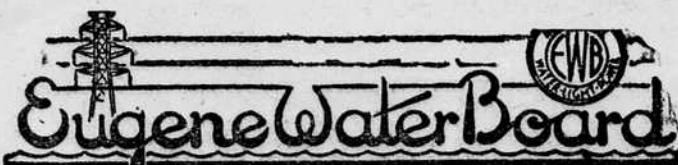
