

# Navy Discharges Willis C. Warren

Willis C. Warren, acting librarian at the University before entering the navy two years ago, is now awaiting his discharge in Seattle. His wife, Elizabeth Warren, instructor in home economics in the University, has flown to Seattle to meet him. They are expected to return to their home in Eugene Sunday night.

A lieutenant in the navy, Warren was stationed in San Francisco, San Diego, and Los Angeles before being sent to Adak island in the Aleutians. Until the end of the war, he was working with port control. Since then he has been in charge of personnel in Adak.

Before being graduated from the University in 1930, Warren worked in the library. In 1934 he received his master of arts degree here.

From the time of his graduation until entering the navy he worked for the University library except for a short time spent in California during 1935, when he received his certificate in librarianship.
