Children of France Receive Contributions

A campus drive for the French relief of children will begin on a small scale tomorrow evening in Gerlinger hall at the meeting of the first year French club.

Members, who have previously filled out a correspondence questionnaire, have agreed to contribute necessary articles towards the completion of separate boxes to be sent to Vence, France. The boxes will be distributed among children attending Centre Scholaire, an elementary school for children between the ages of eight and fifteen. As most of the children have been victimized by the war, contributions will be comprised of articles such as food and clothing necessary to the health and welfare of children undernourished and lacking winter garments. Most of the children are orphans, and a great many of them are refugees.

Featured speaker of the meeting tomorrow evening will be Dr. C. L. Johnson, associate professor of Romance languages, who will speak on French art and French culture.

The meeting will begin at 8 o'clock. All are urged to attend and bring their friends.

Income Tax Rules Explained for Vets

The office of internal revenue has been besieged recently with phone calls from bewildered servicemen and veterans wanting to know whether or not they should file returns by March 15.

The internal revenue bureau hopes to clarify the situation with the following facts:

Enlisted men who have received no pay other than their service pay since 1941 have no return to file. However, if they have earned \$500 or more from outside sources, they must fill out the required tax form. Men who paid income tax on service pay since 1941 should file for a refund.

Commissioned and warrant officers, can deduct \$1500 a year beginning with 1943 from their gross income, as well as the \$500 exemption they are allowed, making a total deduction of \$2000.

Discharged servicemen who are working and who have had income tax deductions made from wages should file for a refund if their wages do not total \$500.

The revenue office explained that all servicemen, whether discharged or still in service, have until the fifteenth day of the sixth month after their return to the United States in which to file tax returns.
