Governor Earl Snell set off a bombshell on February 14 when he proposed to relieve the housing load at the University by conversion of the Klamath Falls marine barracks to a junior college or extension center for student veterans. This suggestion brought on a storm of student opinion and letters to the editor both denouncing and favoring the governor's plan.

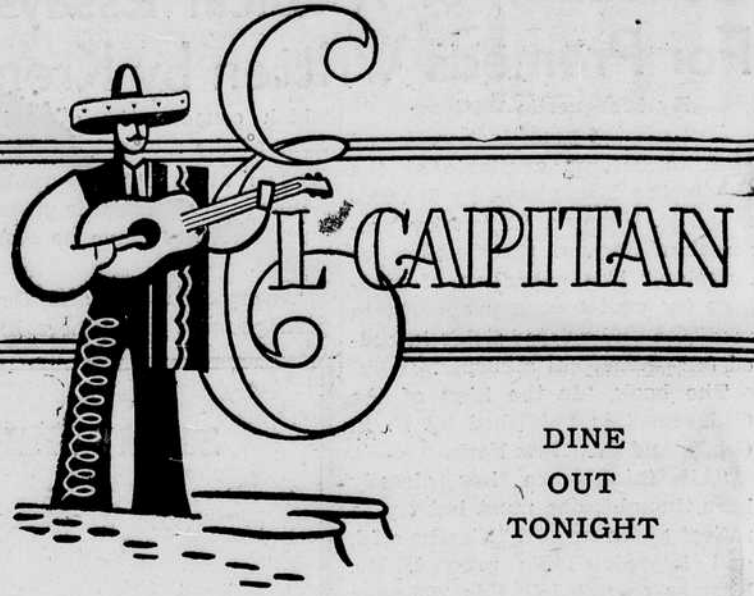
