vice, however, was well recognized by most of the returns. An answer of "Yes" was made on this point in reply to a question "If you are in favor of an increase in student representation do you feel that faculty counsel and advisory aid is understood to be imperative for the successful guidance of student affairs?"

Students Are Mature

An indication of this belief in their own maturity was clearly stated in the large majority affirmative answer to the questions "Do you feel that men and women of college age are old enough and possess the sound judgment required for the administration of student affairs?" and "Do you view student government administered by the students as ones of the aims and purposes of a liberal college education?"

In order to aid in the understanding they desire, the cross-section opinion showed that more information as to just what the boards were actually doing was needed by the students.
