

# AWS Council Vote Ends Traditional Coed Capers

This year's Coed Capers, sponsored by the Associated Women Students, was the final Capers on the Oregon campus. The AWS council has voted to definitely discontinue the Capers because it has been proved that such an event is not worthy of the energies of University women.

The physical damage to Gerlinger hall has resulted in the physical education department's refusal to allow the use of this building again for such a purpose. Activities at the Capers resulted in a damaged floor, broken glass panes, and broken locks on the swimming pool doors. The result of this damage has been considerable expense to the Associated Women Students and to the PE department.

The physical phase of the damage at Gerlinger the night of the Capers was only part of the detrimental activity. Several persons received numerous cuts and bruises,

and various women students were trampled on and knocked out. Refreshments in the Gerlinger sun room were stolen, causing a considerable loss of money to AWS.

Furthermore, the AWS council and their advisers feel that there is now a considerable lack of interest in the Capers, and that the designated functions of the Capers have been modified beyond control. We feel that the Capers is much too lengthy, dull, boring, and definitely not representative of the talent prevalent at the University of Oregon.

Therefore, in lieu of the evidence presented to the AWS council, this group has voted to definitely discontinue the Coed Capers.
