WASHINGTON, May 16.—(UP)—President Truman told a news conference that he would order the nation's railroads taken over by the government if the labor-management dispute is not settled before the Saturday strike deadline.

NEW YORK, May 16.—(UP)—The United Nations Security Council unanimously adopted a secrecy rule permitting it to keep the records of executive sessions from every United Nations member not represented at such closed meetings.

WASHINGTON, May 16.—(UP)—President Truman directed the drafting of men between 20 and 30 years of age.

STUTTGART, Germany, May 16.—(UP)—Eighteen million Germans in the American occupation zone were officially notified that their "hunger" food ration would be cut more than seven per cent to 1,180 calories daily May 27.

WASHINGTON, May 16.—(UP)—President Truman demanded that coal strike disputants let him know by 5:30 p.m. Thursday whether they will submit to arbitration the settlement of their prolonged dispute.


