

Veterans Ask Eugene For 200 Housing Unit

Government housing for veterans versus housing constructed and financed by private enterprise was the question before the Eugene Forum of the Air Tuesday night. Sponsored by the American Veterans Committee, the discussion ended in heated arguments between the speakers and the audience.

Reserve Book Regulation Set By UO Library

According to Dr. Ray C. Swank, head librarian, the new library rules and regulations for reserve books are as follows:

1. Your own library card must be presented for each new book and renewal.
2. Do not loan or lose your card. You are responsible for all books issued on it.
3. A temporary card may be obtained from the circulation department if you do not have the card with you.
4. Books may be taken out of the building, but must be returned when due.
5. Books for overnight use are issued one-half hour before the department closes. Books may be reserved for overnight use any time during the day by filing a reserve slip at the desk.
6. Fines are assessed for the following violations: books returned to the wrong department 25c; failure to recheck books for overnight use 25c; overdue books 25c for first hour or fraction and 5c for each succeeding hour or fraction. A maximum charge of \$1.00 an hour may be made if circumstances justify.
7. Please return your books through the book-chutes. Books may be returned when the department is closed by placing them in book deposit chutes outside the main entrance of the building.
8. When asking for reserve books be sure of the author and title. One may check on these by using the card catalogue to the right of the circulation department.
9. The morning hours in the reserve room start at 8:00 to 10:00 on Monday to Thursday. The hours on Friday and Saturday are: 8:30 to 5:00; and from 2:00 to 9:00 on Sunday.
10. Two new study halls have been added to the reserve system.

Oregon Given ROTC Air Arm

Oregon is one of ten western colleges and universities to offer the reserve air corps program just instituted in the military science department. This program supplements the ROTC infantry courses and has necessitated the addition of an air corps unit to the regular department staff.

Schools in this area which will offer the air corps training during 1946-47 are the University of Oregon, Oregon State college, Stanford, UCLA, Washington State, University of Montana, Montana State, University of Utah, Utah Agricultural college, and University of Nevada.

The University of California, University of Washington, University of Idaho, and Santa Clara will add the course next year.

Complete information about the new training offered may be secured at the ROTC headquarters on the campus.

No Rally Broadcast

The all-campus rally Friday will not be broadcast over KUGN as previously announced, Tom Hazzard, yell king, said Tuesday.

The Forum opened with a short speech by Paul Campbell, local realtor, opposing public housing for Lane county. Campbell's speech was followed by talks from George Hall, veterans housing director for the University; George Hedding, commander of the local VFW post, and James Rodman Jr., chairman of the Oregon Republican central committee.

200 Units Wanted

Hedding threw a challenge at the Lane county realty board, in the course of his speech, when he said, "I challenge the realty board in this county, to build or have built, 200 low cost housing units within six months." This request was answered by Rodman, who stated that anything is possible, if the federal government will move out and give private enterprise the chance to accomplish something, without having to cut through miles of red tape and resort to black market methods.

Rodman was joined by Campbell in this contention and stated emphatically that 500 units could be built in 90 days if OPA would release the materials to private contractors.

Red-Baiting

George Hall injected the first heat into the meeting when he said, "The moment something of this nature is brought up, the realty board and other staunch supporters of private enterprise, point their collective fingers and howl 'communist'." He recounted his experiences in getting housing when he returned to Eugene from the service and ended his story with the statement that private enterprise has failed the veteran in this locality.

The audience directed several questions at the speakers, of varying degrees of heat, all questions markedly favoring a public housing project of some sort.

Following the forum, the speakers decided to hold a meeting today to discuss temporary public housing for veterans in the Eugene area.
