## Webb Takes to Air For Coos Bay Talk

Carl C. Webb's trusty automobile proved not so trusty Tuesday and he had to fly to his Coos Bay speaking engagement.

When his car failed to respond, Mr. Webb, assistant professor of journalism, chartered a plane from the Cottage Grove airport and landed on the coast in time to open National Newspaper week there with a talk at the Coos Bay Rotary club. Manager of the Oregon Newspaper Publishers association, Webb centered his speech around the individual's privileges and responsibilities under freedom of the press.

"It is the responsibility of the individual," said Webb, "to give the reporter facts. Particularly information on questions of controversy." He stressed the fact that the newspaper is often forced to give a one-sided picture because of one faction's failure to give out information. Professor Webb added that loss of freedom of the press is loss to the individual.

Also in connection with National Newspaper week, associate professor of journalism, Warren C. Price, will appear at the Coos Bay Lions club Friday.

Members of Phi Gamma Delta and Phi Kappa Psi are scheduled to have Oregana pictures taken at Kennel-Ellis studio today.

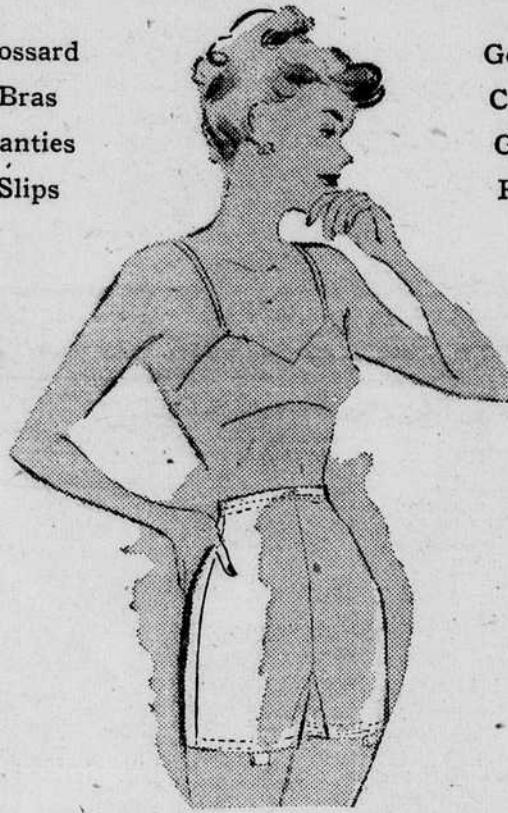
