To clear up present misconceptions about all terminal leave payments we print the regulation as it now stands.

"The completed form (blank terminal leave forms may be obtained at the Eugene post office, postal savings window) which must be notarized by an official authorized by law to administer oaths, should be mailed, together with the discharge certificate, or a photostatic copy, or a certified copy of the discharge certificate, to the appropriate army, navy or marine corps or coast guard paying officer at the address listed on the reverse side of the claim form. It is advisable to send other than the original discharge certificate, if possible."

Army and paying officer officials hope to pay claims 60 days of the date of application. Bonds will be used in paying most claims totaling

more than \$18.75 for the accrued leave earned.

Only small claims less than the face value of an \$18.75 bond will be paid in cash. However, if a veteran has \$40 owed him, he will be given a \$37.50 bond and the remainder in cash (check). Similarly, a veteran warranting payment of \$80 will receive a \$75 bond and the remaining \$5 in check.

A dispatch from Washington states that government machinery is now geared to pay out \$2,700,000,000 in terminal leave payments due World War II veterans. It is advisable to fill out terminal leave forms immediately if you have not yet done so.

It will be further recommended that the University take the necessary steps to temporarily convert its property at Fourteenth and

Alder for student parking and that the city manager be instructed to seek the use of the unused private property at the Northwest corner of Thirteenth and Alder for public parking. This lot is owned by the Sacred Heart Hospital.

The streets committee will also recommend that the parking of standing automobiles be prohibited on the east side of Kincaid from Eleventh to Thirteenth, and that further study be given to the proposal to eliminate parking on Thirteenth between Alder and Kincaid in connection with the development of off-street parking facilities.
