Apply Now For Dorm Housing

Students attending the University and living in temporary housing may now apply for dormitory reservations for winter term. Applications should be made at the dormitory office in Johnson hall.

Under a priority system, students who are registered in the University will until November 2, have first call on dormitory space. After that date all students now enrolled will be assigned space in order of application.

During fall term the veterans' dormitory was reserved beyond normal capacity, giving as many veterans as possible an opportunity to enter school at the opening of the present academic year. A second veterans' dormitory will be opened

Both dormitories will be operated on the basis of single, double, and triple rooms. Under the new set-up veterans will have more comfortable living conditions than existed this term.

It is also anticipated that the cafeteria located between the two veterans' dorms will be completed for the opening of winter term.

Persons not now enrolled in the University who expect to register for winter term must receive clearance from the registrar's office before applying for rooms in the dormitories.

Likewise, Donovan was not considered a good candidate by the old guard Republicans; namely, because of his lack of labor support, his close affiliations with Franklin D. Roosevelt, and most important because Tom Dewey, as a candidate for the presidency, fears the personal following Bill Donovan might build up in New York as a U. S. senator. Dewey fears the competition of a fellow prima donna who goes off the reservation with each political flirtation.

So looking over the field, the Republicans could not consider such a person as Robert Moses, who eschews religious affiliation in politics. For the lack of a better way they almost literally reached in the hat and pulled out the name of Irving Ives, a comparative unknown from the state legislature. This could cost them the chance to gain a senate seat.
