Dr. Munk organized training centers of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation administration in England, Egypt, Greece, Italy, and other countries during the crucial months of the war. Thus he was able to study the economical, political, and relief problems of Europe and the near east. He also appointed director of training for UNRRA throughout the world.
