

Signe said in a letter to her parents, that there is plenty of everything in Sweden but fuel. As there are no coal deposits in Sweden, the only fuel is wood or coal imported from Germany. The supply of imported coal from this source was, of course, cut down during the war. Copper, glassware, and a beautiful and efficient Swedish fire place called a "kekslugn" are among the souvenirs the Larsens are sending home.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Larson graduated from the University of Oregon last spring. Signe was a member of Mortar Board, and president of the AWS her senior year.




The Gad-a-bout

The Emerald got its name because Joaquin Miller called Oregon the Emerald state.


