Air Corps Men Are Announced At University

Three air corps officers of the regular army are enrolled this term at the University and are now discharging their daily military duties by attending eight o'clocks, ten o'clocks, and two o'clocks along with other Oregon undergraduates.

The officers are Maj. Fred T. Furchner and Maj. Alfred D. Belson, business administration, and Capt. Charles R. Stanton, journalism major. All have junior standing and were former residents of Oregon.

The trio are assigned to the Air university, based at Maxwell Field, Ala., and were re-assigned from there to their present scholastic chores. Having donned "civvies" for their new and rigorous regime, they have become undistinguishable among the large campus population of returned veterans.

The airmen chose their own program of studies, subject approval of the army, which foots the bill for tuition and all fixed fees. The fliers themselves bought textbooks and scrambled for housing.

The officers will return to active duty with air forces this summer but will be back at Oregon again next fall. Meanwhile, they will keep up with required flying time for a certain number of hours during the school year.

The men will get their time in the air from McChord field, near Tacoma, Wash. Arrangements have been made for a plane from the field to pick them up at Eugene on weekends, the campus ROTC air section reports.

Major Furchner acts as senior officer in charge of the group, all of whom keep in close touch with the University military science department for orders and instructions.
