tative, and will provide specific information about this program.

Students selected by these competitive examinations will be offered entrance in either the Naval Reserve Officers Training corps (NROTC) or the Naval Aviation College program (NACP).

Those selecting the former program will attend one of the 52 colleges or universities having NROTC units where they will receive from the government the cost of their tuition, books, and normal fees and \$50.00 a month for the four-year period of education.

Those selecting the Naval Aviation College program may go to any accredited university or college of their choice, providing they are accepted for entrance, and receive the same government benefits.

on the campus, I believe. (Eds. note:
Only one of the men mentioned are
now on the campus.)

"—— and I talked of TNE between ourselves that summer and he said he'd heard of several comments of (three houses) at OSC being strong on TNE and he also found a TNE pin inside one of his roommate's sweaters.

"In the fall term of 1942 I was approached by three fellows who I presumed to be members of the football squad. They went to great pains—which I took as a joke—to remain in the dark and asked if I'd heard of Theta Nu Epsilon fraternity and was interested. They left, saying they'd contact me later.

"— didn't seem to take it serious . . . but did tell us of — being treasurer of the outlaw organization the previous year. (He) also said — used to make contacts through the — house with a couple of girls. (He) was first contacted the previous spring term during track season into the TNE.
