

Rose Bowl Patrons Protest Army Oust

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Ernest Newquist and his 532 friends, who yesterday sent a blistering telegram to Coast Conference officials, wired an appeal today to Big Nine authorities to "Reconsider your action and let us have Army."

Newquist said 300-word telegrams had been sent to Big Nine Commissioner K. L. Wilson and athletic directors at Illinois and Michigan, vehemently protesting "The bumping of the greatest team in the nation."

The message was signed: "563 disgusted but hopeful patrons of the Rose Bowl who do not want to turn tickets into pickets."

All women veterans, duly registered under the G.I. Bill, who are contemplating withdrawing from their course major, dropping one course, or withdrawing from school entirely, should report to the veteran adviser, Glenn Sweeney, in the basement of Johnson hall. Some have failed to do this and they jeopardize any further training under the G. I. Bill.

Government checks are generally mailed from the Portland office on the last day of the month. With this in mind, veterans can begin eating again on or about the second of December.

Veterans who have been experiencing difficulty in receiving subsistence checks from the VA may get loans or relief from the Red Cross while awaiting their benefit checks. A suggestion is made that veterans contact Mr. Hall and receive a statement which may be taken to the Red Cross for authorization. The Red Cross office is at 43 W. 8th street, phone 63.

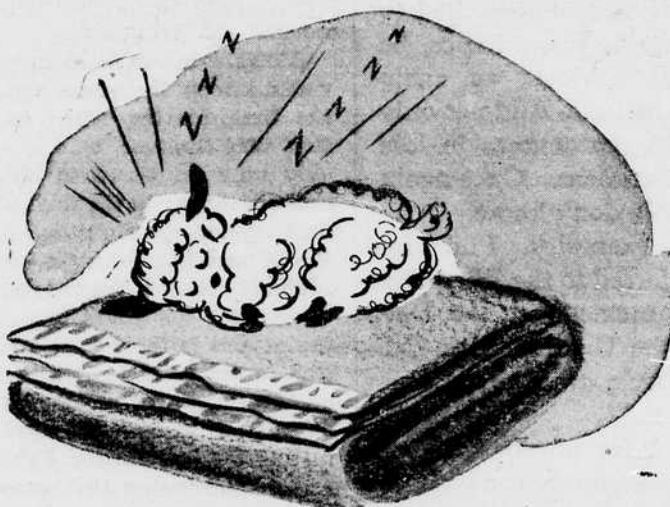
