Hall Says Vets Card Stamp Last

George Hall, assistant dean of men, has reminded veterans to complete registration for all courses before coming to his office for validating veteran identification cards.

Mr. Hall said that stamping of veteran's cards should be the last step before going to the cashier's window. This way the student is sure of getting proper distribution of books and supplies from the Co-op.

His office will not validate the cards until all other steps in registration, except payment of fees, has been completed. While veterans do not actually pay the regular University registration fees themselves, it is still necessary to turn in their forms and obtain clearance from the cashier.

It is necessary for all men students, including veterans, to obtain housing clearance at the dean of men's office downstairs in Johnson hall. Students will turn in, at this time, a dual card, and both the upper and lower half should be completely filled out.

Mr. Hall said also that veterans who have received from the VA temporary certificates of eligibility, for periods less than they are actually entitled to, should write the VA for a certificate for additional

eligibility if the VA does not send it after a reasonable length of time. In any event, he said, the veteran should be sure he gets his certificate well before the temporary eligibility expires, as he will not be permitted to register under the GI bill without it.
