While the University of Oregon Webfoots were carving out a second division spot in Coast conference standing, statistically they were a hot and cold outfit. In some departments the Ducks more than held their own, while in others Webfoot performances were below par.

Coach Tex Oliver's lads had a

total of 350 rushing tries to opponents 398. While the Ducks were moving for 1428 yards with the oval the opposition was racking up 1657 yards. Average yardage rushing rushing per play stood Oregon 3.3—opponents 3.6.

Of the five leading ball carriers Sam Ramey had the fattest average with 3.9 for 17 tries. Bobby Reynolds took over the second position with a 3.7 average for 60 carrying attempts.

Halfbacks Jimmy Newquist and Jake Leicht tied for third place with an average of 3.2. Newquist was the workhorse of the lot. He carried 90 times. Leicht lugged the leather 66 times. Bob Koch managed to average 2.8 yards in 69 trips into the line.

Fullback Koch ran off with punting honors by averaging a healthy

37.2 yards for 59 kicks. Oregon punting as a whole was three yards per kick better than the best the opposition could muster. In 89 tries the Ducks managed to send kicks for 36.1 yards.

In the first down department Webfoot backs racked up a total of 57—to the opponents 57. However opposition backs fattened this total of 57 with 20 from passing and two from penalties to lead the Ducks in this department 68 to

79. The Webfoots gained 11 first downs from overhead attempts.

Duck Penalties Heavy

In the gift division the Webfoots handed out 360 yards to opponents via penalties. The eager lads on the other side of the line had 235 yards paced off against them. This left the Ducks with a 125 yard deficit in penalties.

Webfoot backs outstaidied the opposition in fumbling, having 30 miscues to their credit, while the

Ducks' nine enemy aggregations let it go 37 times. Oregon recovered 11 of its own and 23 opposing fumbles. The opposition picked up 14 of their own and 19 of Oregon's 30.

The opposition marked up 118 points against the big green machine via 18 touchdowns, one field goal and seven conversions. Coach Oliver's men stacked up 81 counters by virtue of 12 TD's, and nine conversions.

The Oregon Jayvee football squad finished their 1946 season with no wins and three losses charged against them, and two of the losses are accountable to the OSC junior varsity.

Coach John Warren gave mention to Tackle Lou Robinson, Left Halfback Bill Hutchinson and Tackle Dean Sheldon as being a trio of ball players who with a little more experience should go places. Throughout the season Robinson has been a rough and tough tackle for opposing linemen to handle.

One thing the Jayvees can remember is that they held the Southern College of Education, who are one of the unbeaten teams of the nation today, down to 12 points and played more than even ball with them. Some of the players said that if Oregon was given another chance they would beat them.

The team as a whole feels that the OSC aggregation was the toughest with emphasis placed on the backfield combination of Ditz and Vallincour.

The Jayvees scored 26 points during their season play to the oppositions 87, and they were badly outplayed on the statistical side.
