Major Frizzell, who headed the Emerald sports staff in 1936-37, is at present on leave from Washington, D. C., where he is stationed in the research and development division of the war department general staff. He will return to Washington late this month.

Before his graduation from the University in 1940, Major Frizzell, esides working on the Emerald, was for a year and a half sports editor of the now-extinct Eugene Daily News, and served as a newswriter on the Eugene Register-Guard from 1938 until his graduation in 1940.

From 1940 until he enlisted in the army air forces in January of 1942. Major Frizzell did sports reporting for the Portland Oregonian. In September of 1942 he received a second lieutenant's commission from (AAF) administrative officers' candidates school at Miami Beach, Florida.

Major Frizzell saw overseas duty from November, 1942, to April, 1946, serving in England, France, Germany, and other smaller European countries. While in England, he married a girl whom he met while stationed in London.

Major Frizzell, while in Eugene, visited many old friends, including George S. Turnbull, dean of the school of journalism, from whom he once took classes as an undergraduate student, Leonard Jermain and Paul Deutschmann, Emerald edwors during years when Frizzell was at the University, Thomas Wright, junior in journalism, and Frank Evans, Emerald linotype op-

Major Frizzell expects to be discharged soon, after which he will return to newspaper work.


#### Open Rushing Resumes
