

Jobs Offered Students After Commencement

Graduating students who are interested in early employment of a permanent nature should register immediately with Dean Karl W. Onthank, director of the graduate placement service in room 6, Friendly. Representatives from several business firms and national organizations are expected on the campus next week to interview students for job training and placement.

Wayne W. Thompson, director of education for the North American Insurance company, will be on the campus February 7 to interview men who would be interested in entering the company's six-month training program, during which the single trainees will receive a salary of \$175 and married men \$200.

,Salary Guaranteed

Upon graduation the trainee is guaranteed a salary ranging from \$225 to \$250 per month for the next six months. Applicants need not be business majors or students of insurance.

Especially suitable for women is a scholarship offer of the National Tuberculosis association for university or college graduates to train for positions as executive secretaries, field secretaries, and health directors with the association. Maintenance and travel expenses will be paid to the students at the training center, and they will receive salaries of \$100 monthly during the seven-week seminar and one to fourmonth practical field training period.

Jobs Await Trainees

Upon completion of training the trainees will be employed by local branches of the association at beginning salaries ranging from \$1000 to \$2000. Both men and women are eligible for these scholarships.

Miss Beryl Smith, representative of the National Tuberculosis association will visit the campus Friday to interview applicants for the scholarships. Interested students should arrange early this week for an interview with Miss Smith at the placement office.
