Parker to Open Vesper Services

Dr. Pierson Parker, of Berkeley, California, will be the principal speaker at the one-hour non-denominational vesper service to be held in the music auditorium Sunday at 4 p.m. under the auspices of the University religious council.

Dr. Parker comes to the campus as a teacher, author, scholar, and speaker. He now holds the chair of New Testament and homiletics at the Church Divinity School of the Pacific, the Western Episcopal seminary.

This is the first vesper service of the current school year, under the sponsorship of the newly organized University religious council, and follows along closely with the idea of bringing leading religious personalities to the campus throughout the year, as well as during the fall term Religious Emphasis week.

Music for the service will be furnished by a select group from the choral union, under the direction of Donald W. Allton, assistant professor of music.

Students, faculty, and townspeople are invited to this first in a series of new vesper services.

Alexander to Exhibit Weaving and Jewelry

A one-man exhibit of weaving and jewelry will be held January 19 to February 8 at the ceramic studios in Portland by Lynn Alexander, University student working on his master's degree.

A graduate of 1942, Alexander will exhibit about a dozen large three-yard weaving samples along with several smaller patterns and show several silver rings in the jewelry section.

Alexander has participated in two previous exhibits, one in pottery at the ceramic studio in 1942 and another last spring at Wichita, Kansas, in the National Ceramic art show, in which he took first prize in weaving.

Mu Phi Schedule Talk

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
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
