Oregon Women Head National Aquatic Tourney

Amphibian, women's swimming honorary, has taken on extra responsibility this year as it will sponsor the women's national inter-collegiate telegraphic swim meet. Besides swimming in the meets, which are to be held at the University on February 26 and March 5, the girls will be compiling results as they are wired in from competing colleges all over the nation. Work will not be complete until final results have been determined and reports sent to all of the entrants.

Compete at Home

Schools compete in their own pools and wire their times to the sponsor. From then on it is the sponsor's responsibility to complete the figuring.

Each year one college is asked to sponsor the meet and that school is responsible for compiling all the results, times, and sending the final results to all competing schools. Colleges are divided into two groups, those with an enrollment of more than 1000 women and those schools with less than 1000 women. Results are made on the basis of the combined groups but schools are placed individually in both groups. Last year the University was second in its division and seventh nationally in competition with all schools regardless of size.

All of the Oregon team members are required to participate in a certain number of practices and follow training rules. According to Miss Margaret Brewster, coach, Sylvia Branden, anchor of the Hen-

dricks Hall swimming team fall term, has been showing well in practice to date. Miss Branden swims the 40 and 100 yard free style events.
