

Joseph Schuster Rejects 'Glamor Boy Cellist' Title

Joseph Schuster, publicized as the glamor boy of the cello, would rather be known for his performances than for his "sparkling" and "flashing" black eyes as some newspapers feature, he said before his concert Wednesday.

Although he is left-handed, Schuster plays the cello in the conventional manner with the bow in his right hand.

Schuster said that he had heard much news about Eugene from other concert artists who had played here. "You will have much to live up to," he remarked.

Transportation Difficult

"Arriving here by train from Pullman, Washington, Schuster was greatly concerned about his plane reservations to Denver, where he will give his next concert. "We've been having difficulties with transportation all along the tour," he said.

One of his recent performances was given at Astoria, where he gave the opening concert in their series, the first to be given there in six years.

Russian Education

Born in Constantinople, Schuster received his musical education

in Russia and is now an American citizen. He proudly displayed pictures of his attractive wife, a native of Couer d'Alene, Idaho, and his two-year-old son Johnnie.

His English is accurate, but colored with an accent. Spelling still gives him some difficulty, he said, commenting that one thing he could make good use of would be a pocket dictionary.

Likes Air Travel

Last spring he went on a concert tour of South America, giving about three performances every week. "We traveled by plane during the whole trip," he said. "As far as my accompanist and I are concerned, that's the only way to travel."

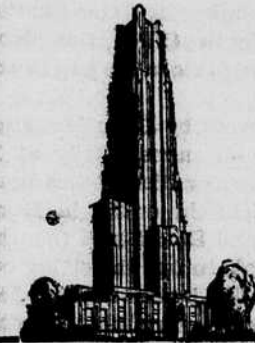
